# 1-to-1 Contact Link

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## Purpose of the add-on

1-to-1 Contact Link is an ACT! add-on that allows linking a contact to another contact so that, by clicking a button on your layout, you may quickly go to the linked contact without having to go through the usual lookup procedure.

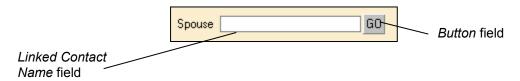
#### How it works

You need 2 fields to create a 1-to-1 link:

- a field which will store the name of the Linked Contact Name and will be referred to as the Linked Contact Name field in this manual.
- o a field which will serve as a button and will be referred to as the *Button* field.

#### **Example of a Spouse link**

Here is an example of how the link will look: we created a field named *Spouse* and a field named *GoToSpouse*. We formatted the *GoToSpouse* field so that it looks like a button.



When we enter the Spouse field, the following window appears.



Through a lookup or using the navigation arrows, we just have to go to the contact we want to link with, in this case, the contact's spouse. When we have made her/him the active contact, we may either click the 1-way button or the 2-way button. The 2-way button will create a bidirectional link, i.e. a reverse link will be created in both contacts. This would be the button to click for the "spouse" example.

From now on, clicking the GO button of either contact will automatically take us to the other contact.

To edit the link, we simply enter the *Spouse* field and the same *Spouse* window will appear allowing us to link to a different contact.

You may create as many links as you want and they don't have to be bi-directional. You may want to create links to link a contact to her/his accountant, lawyer, architect, etc.

## Steps to create a link

After you installed the program, here are the steps to create a link.

**NOTE:** you need to be a database administrator to create a link.

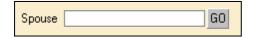
#### Step 1: create or modify 2 fields

You may decide to create new fields or use existing fields. It does not matter. This is done from the ACT! Define fields window (Edit | Define fields). Here are the requirements for these fields.

|                 | Linked Contact Name field | Button field   |
|-----------------|---------------------------|--|

| Default value   | Leave blank               | GO (or whatever you want but no more than 10 characters) |

#### **Step 2: modify your layout**

Now you may want to modify your layout so that the Button field look like a real button:

Don't forget to remove the tab order on the 2 fields, ie. click the number at the right of the fields. The number will disappear which means the fields will not be in the tab order anymore.



## Step 3: copy the caption of the button to all contacts

Copy your *Button* field default value (GO or whatever you chose) in the *Button* field for all the contacts. To do this, go to ACT! *Edit* menu, choose *Replace* and type the default value in the *Button* field. Then go to the *Replace* menu and choose *Apply*. When prompted, choose to modify *All contacts*.

From now on, the caption will show in all contacts and new contacts will automatically inherit it since it is the default value of the *Button* Field.

#### Step 4: find out the Button field internal ID number

Each field is identified by ACT! by its internal numeric ID. To know what the ID of your *Button* field is, run the *actdiag.exe* program located in the ACT! folder by double-clicking it in Windows Explorer, then go to the *Reports* menu and choose *Database Fields Report*. You will be prompted to choose a database and log into it, then asked if you want the report to be displayed in Notepad. Say yes and you'll get a report like this:

The field ID is shown next to the field name. If you don't remember the field name of your *Button* field, place your cursor in it and then go to the *Edit*|*Define Fields* window. The name of the field will be automatically selected in the left column.

#### Step 5: add the necessary triggers

#### Button field trigger:

- o go to the Edit|Define fields window
- Select the Button Field name in the list on the left, go under the *Triggers* tab.
- o Click in the Launch when entering field box
- o Press the ... button that appears to the right of the box and go to the add-on folder (by default this would be C:\Program Files\Exponencie\\1-to-1 Contact Link)
- Select the GoToContact.exe file and click Open.

#### Linked Contact Name trigger:

- Now, while you are still in the Edit|Define fields window, select the Linked Contact Name field in the list on the left
- o Click in the Launch when entering field box under the Triggers tab
- o Press the ... button
- o In the same folder as before, select 1-to-1Contact Link.exe and click open.

- The path of the file appears now in the Launch when entering field box. To the end of this path, insert a space then a forward slash and the field ID of the button field.
  The path should look like this:
  - C:\Program Files\Exponenciel\1-to-1 Contact Link\1-to-1Contact Link.exe /51

## **Editing a link**

To edit a link, simply enter the *Linked Contact Name field* and the *1-to-1 Contact Link* window will appear. Then create a new link as described in *How it works* above.

## **Deleting a link**

To delete a link, enter the *Linked Contact Name* field and the *1-to-1 Contact Link* window will appear. Do a right-click in this window and select *Delete the current link* in the popup menu.

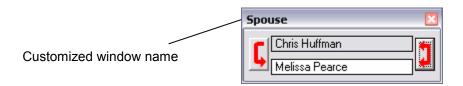
## Deleting multiple links at a time

To delete multiple links at a time, create a lookup of the contacts you want to delete the link for. Then go to ACT! *Edit* menu and select *Replace*. Type <<BLANK>> (CTRL+F5 shortcut) in the *Linked Contact Name* field. Type the caption of the button in the *Button* field. Then go to the *Replace* menu and choose *Apply*. When prompted, choose to modify the *Current lookup*.

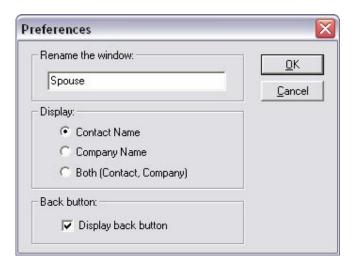
### **Preferences**

#### Changing the name of the *1-to-1 Contact Link window*

Particularly if you set up more than one link, you might want to customize the name that appears at the top of the *1-to-1 Contact Link* window to remember the link that you are currently updating, as shown below.



To do this, go to the *Preferences* window (do a right-click in the *1-to-1 Contact Link* window and select *Preferences* from the popup menu) and type a new name in the *Rename* the window field.



#### Displaying the company name or both the contact and company names

By default, 1-to-1 Contact Link copies the contact's name to the Linked Contact Name field. If you would rather copy the company name or the contact's name followed by the company name, go to the Preferences window and select the appropriate option.

**NOTE:** Changing the *Display* preferences will not affect links that have already been created: it only affects future links.

#### Displaying a back button

You also have the option to have 1-to-1 Contact Link display a Back button after the program takes you to a linked contact, so that you may quickly go back to the contact of origin.

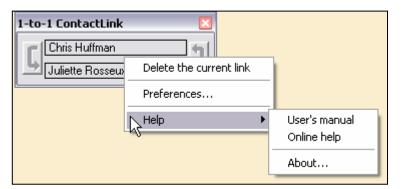


This *Back* button is a small always-on-top floating window which position is saved every time you click it. So you may position it wherever you want in your workplace.

To display a back button, check the *Display back button* in the *Preferences* window (see ablove).

## Animated tutorials – Online help

The *Help* menu gives you access to our *Online Help* where you will find a number of animated tutorials. To access the *Help* menu, do a right-click on the *1-to-1 Contact Link* window.
